

In June 2018, RCSI formally opened a new, state-ofthe-art building at 26 York Street in Dublin's city centre, consolidating its role as a global leader in the provision of education, training and lifelong learning for healthcare leaders of the future.





Designed to provide hands-on practical and professional healthcare training in multiple learning and study environments, 26 York Street is the largest and most modern facility of its kind in Europe. Benchmarked against best-in-class, it provides a world-class clinical learning environment attuned to the needs of a changing healthcare world, delivering a truly transformative clinical learning experience. The centrepiece of the new building is a 12,000sq. ft Simulation Centre, laid out over three floors. Here, students and healthcare professionals have access to a world-class surgical and training suite with clinical skills labs, mock operating theatre and clinical training wards.

The facilities at 26 York Street provide a national capacity for surgeons to refresh their skills and to avail of innovative techniques and international advancements.



The new Medical Quarter - an architectural blend of tradition and modernity on the west side of St Stephen's Green - will create a vibrant campus atmosphere for RCSI's almost 3,800 students and 1,150 staff.
