BEACON STATUS IN SUSTAINABLE HEALTHCARE

In February, RCSI became the first institution in the Republic of Ireland to be awarded Beacon Status in Sustainable Healthcare. Achieving this reflects RCSI's commitment to integrating a more environmentally, socially and financially sustainable approach to healthcare education.

MS. AMINA J. MOHAMMED DELIVERED THE 29TH CARMICHAEL LECTURE

In February 2022, Ms. Amina J. Mohammed, Deputy Secretary-General of the United Nations and Chair of the United Nations Sustainable Development Group delivered the 29th Carmichael Lecture and was also awarded an Honorary Fellowship, RCSI's highest distinction. Delegates gathered both in-person and online for the prestigious address, held in RCSI University of Medicine and Health Sciences in Dublin. Ms Mohammed spoke on 'Transforming Education to Transform our World by 2030'.

SCHOOL OF POPULATION HEALTH

This year, we also established a new School of Population Health with Professor Edward Gregg as Head of School. Together with a multidisciplinary team of committed researchers and advocates, Professor Gregg will be at the forefront of RCSI's commitment to delivering educational programmes and driving research which improves the health of human populations across the world. The School's first educational

focus will be on a series of postgraduate taught programmes aimed at upskilling the public health workforce.

RACE EQUALITY ACTION PLAN

In November, RCSI became the first university in Ireland to publish an action plan aimed at advancing race equality and tackling racism. As one of the country's most internationally diverse universities, RCSI's Race Equality Action Plan reinforces its commitment to ensuring that the experience of its students, trainees and staff is defined by respect, equality and inclusion. BEAUMONT RCSI CANCER CENTRE - OECI ACCREDITATION

The Beaumont RCSI Cancer Centre – a collaboration between RCSI, Beaumont Hospital and St Luke's Radiation Oncology Network – has been accredited by the Organisation European Cancer Institutes (OECI) who set comprehensive standards for cancer centres in Europe. The Centre, independently evaluated by a team of experts, was praised as "a patient-centred organisation with well-coordinated research structures and a dynamic education system".





TRADE-RELATED ASPECTS OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (TRIPS) WAIVER

RCSI became the first higher education institution and postgraduate training body in Ireland to call on the Irish government to endorse the Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) waiver which would pave the way for the generic production of medicines and provide low- and middle-income countries access to COVID-19 vaccines and other treatments.

PROMOTING PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

REACH RCSI piloted a new initiative with the RCSI School of Physiotherapy for students to promote physical activity among local primary school children.

BEST GREEN CAMPUS AWARD

RCSI was announced as winner of the Best Green Campus Award at the annual Education Awards ceremony on 6 April, 2022. The Education Awards recognise, encourage, and celebrate excellence in the third level education sector on the island of Ireland from both State and privately funded institutions. The award was made to RCSI in recognition of its strong

commitment to making a positive environmental impact and contributing to a sustainable future. The award recognises the commitment of RCSI's team to sustainability and its commitment to the UN's Sustainable Development Goals.




