Educational background	Denis holds an M.B., B.Ch., B.A.O (1976), M.Ch. (1986), F.R.C.S.I. (1980)
Summary of Career to date. (Max 100 words)	<p>Following training in Ireland, the UK and the US, Denis completed his Senior Registrar training in Dublin. He was a lecturer in surgery in RCSI / Beaumont hospital before taking up a Consultant General Surgical post in Galway. Denis has been a consultant general surgeon in University Hospital, Galway since 1988 where he carried out and encouraged surgical trainees to get involved in research, including laboratory and basic clinical projects and supervising a number of MMSC projects.</p> <p>In 1991, he was appointed senior lecturer in Surgery in NUIG. In that position he was involved at all levels, teaching and examining students and basic and higher surgical trainees. He has also been a member of the court of examiners for the primary and second part examinations for the fellowship and the MRCS of the College of Surgeons in Ireland.</p> <p>During the last fifteen years, Denis travelled to international centers to develop cutting edge surgical techniques, particularly in the areas of endocrine and vascular surgery. In 2017 Denis took up position as Associate Professor of Surgery in RCSI Bahrain.</p> <p>In 2020 he returned to work in the Galway Clinic. For the past two years Denis has held the position of Medical Director of the Galway Clinic, a hospital in Galway which is a teaching affiliate of both RCSI and NUIG. Currently an honorary associate clinical Professor of surgery of RCSI Dublin.</p>
