Teaching Experience:

Professor of Paediatrics RCSI Bahrain responsible for the effective delivery of the teaching programme in Child Health to 120 students per year in 5 modules.

I was an Honorary Senior Lecturer for NUI Galway and give regular teaching session to medical undergraduates and postgraduates as well as to Speech and Language and Occupational Therapy Students. I am particularly passionate about teaching about Cerebral Palsy and Neurological Examination which even many postgraduate doctors find “difficult”. I take school students for a day experience in the summer months to show them what a medical doctor does and to explain to them the commitment needed to succeed as a medical student. I was involved in the supervision of trainee paramedics during their paediatric attachment.

I was a trainer on the Specialist Registrar Scheme in Ireland and responsible for one trainee each year. I met each trainee weekly to discuss progress and career progression. I have helped the trainees in a number of publications. I have acted as mentor to a number of registrars who are now consultants in the Ireland, the UK and abroad
