Teaching Experience:

I have started at RCSI Bahrain as a lecturer for Health Care Assistance. I worked with Prof. Charles Docherty (Previous Head of School of Nursing and Midwifery) on designing the curriculum of the program and I took the overall responsibility in running this program. The Healthcare Assistants Programme was designed to provide initial training to new recruits, and a career path for the further development of their skills. A total of 3 cohorts comprising 92 students have successfully graduated from the HCA course from June 2011 – June 2012. The course offered job opportunities to the graduates all of whom are employed at KHUH. A paper was presented at the 32nd International Nursing & Midwifery Research Conference - RCSI Dublin titled: Designing and Implementing a Course for Healthcare Assistants: The Experience from Bahrain on 21st February 2013. On September 2012, I started teaching undergraduate nursing students. Beside my teaching responsibilities, I am currently Nursing year one level director and holding this position since September 2013.
