#### **Professor Tanja Manser**

Director of the FHNW School of Applied Psychology, Olten, Switzerland and Foreign Adjunct Professor at CLINTEC, Karolinska Institutet, Stockholm, Sweden

Professor Tanja Manser is Director of the FHNW School of Applied Psychology, Olten, Switzerland and holds a position as Foreign Adjunct Professor at CLINTEC, Karolinska Institutet, Stockholm, Sweden. She is an expert on team performance in healthcare and its relationship to patient safety and clinician well-being. Her research focuses on teamwork in acute care settings, quality and safety of patient handoffs, simulation-based training, clinical risk management, safety climate in healthcare and implementation of patient safety practices.

She has published widely in the field of human factors and health care research and has served on the editorial board of "Simulation in Health Care" and as a senior editor of "Advances in Simulation" for many years. She is currently an editorial board member for Ergonomics and for BMJ Open.

Tanja received a PhD in Psychology form University of Zurich in 2002 and in 2008 she completed her Habilitation at ETH Zurich. From 2014-2017 she was Full Professor for Patient Safety and Director of the Institute for Patient Safety at the University Hospital Bonn, Germany. From 2016-2018 she was affiliated as Adjunct Professor for Patient Safety to the Centre for Resilience in Healthcare (SHARE), Faculty of Health Sciences at the University of Stavanger, Norway. In 2015 she received the German Health Services Research Award.

Dr. Ronan is a graduate of University College Cork (UCC), where he completed both his undergraduate medical degree and postgraduate studies in healthcare professionals' education. He underwent medical and radiology training through the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland and the Faculty of Radiologists at the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland.

During his training, Dr. Ronan led the development of an award-winning, nationally funded programme focused on patient and staff education. This initiative involved the creation of digital educational content for patients which was then disseminated nationally and internationally.

Following the completion of a Fellowship in Vascular Interventional Radiology at Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust in London, Dr. Ronan took up a Consultant Radiologist position at Cork University Hospital. He continues to pursue research in human factors and maintains a strong commitment to medical education.

Dr. Ronan has served as an adjunct clinical lecturer at UCC, contributed hands-on teaching as a faculty member with the British Society of Interventional Radiology, and currently sits on the board of the Society of Anaesthesiology and Radiology.
